

- Scaling up means to expand or replicate pilot or small-scale projects to reach more people and/or broaden the effectiveness of an intervention.
- The process in intertwined with diffusion, dissemination and implementation of innovation.


Scaling up dimensions

A digital product or service successfully scales when it is embedded or institutionalized into the workflow of health system service delivery or a recipient's daily habits.

- Quantitative scaling up: grows the reach of the service
- Diversification/functional scaling up: introduces additional services
- Political scaling up: expands political support ex. networking
- Organizational/institutional scaling up: builds stabilization through strategic alliances between organizations, develops capacity to sustain programmatic efforts


What does it take to scale a product or service?

- Learning from and comparing with others
- Changing the scale of production or provision
- Build know-how and capacity
- Allocate adequate funding
- Design and implement an iterative process
- Adaptations
- Workforce upskilling and reskilling





European Scaling-up strategy in Active and Healthy Ageing




Figure 1: EIP AHA model of the implementation stages.

Definition of scaling up


WHO Guide for scaling up¹ defines the term as

"(...) <u>deliberate efforts</u> to increase the impact of health service <u>innovations</u> <u>successfully tested</u> in pilot or experimental projects so as to benefit more people and to foster <u>policy and programme</u> <u>development on a lasting basis</u>."
